That's the end of the regular meeting, I noticed some people here who have a presentation to make, before they do that, I just want to explain to you, Mr. Schmitt, at our last meeting, you had questioned whether it was a conflict of interest with a particular position, and we had received a Memo from our Town Attorney a year or two before that, which said there was no conflict of interest.

Excuse me, now we have to have a dialogue, you have to come up on the mic.

(Laughter)

I'm sorry.

JOHN SCHMITT, 139 CAMPFIRE ROAD NORTH

I should know better.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

All right.

To put that on the Record, yes, I did receive a copy of the information from Mrs. McCabe that everything is satisfactory. In fact, I was happy with the response.

I just wanted to get back to you, okay?

SUPERVISOR BREESE

All right, now I believe somebody here would like to make a presentation, is that correct? To the Town Board?

(From audience - "Yes, that's correct.")

SUPERVISOR BREESE

How do you want to do this? We want to help you make it easy.

(From audience - inaudible)

COUNCILWOMAN McCABE

You have to be on the mic.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

We have to have a name on the mic.

COUNCILWOMAN McCABE

. . . and the name, right. There we go. *(Laughter)*

(Sign Language Interpreter, Denise Green, Sign Language Connection, Inc.)

LISA HOWARD

Hello, hello. My name is Lisa Howard, I'm representing actually, the three (3) families here. We just wanted to come and meet with you and talk to you about the possibility of receiving your help with funding, with regard to paying for interpreters. Our children are cheerleaders and football players, they're all deaf, they're extremely involved with the Henrietta community, very much involved with the people here, and the organization that they play sports with and cheerlead with is a non-profit organization, and they're really struggling to find funding for interpreters. Our three (3) kids are very involved and they said that they weren't able to pay, so we came to this meeting in this District to see if there was any way to fund interpreters for the football and cheerleading programs, if you would even consider something like that, we did send a letter, we are very much interested in discussing more about that if possible, I don't know if there's anything else I can add?

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Okay, thank you. I'd like to ask Regis Steinkamp, our Director of Youth and Recreation, if you could add anything to this discussion about this particular issue, which I presume you heard?

LISA HOWARD

Actually, I just want to clear something up a little bit. We did actually speak to him but he's related to the Town of Henrietta, our organization is actually related to, it's a private organization, but it is related to the Rush-Henrietta District, so it is under Rush-Henrietta, but it's not under the Town Hall, our team is actually representing Rush-Henrietta, so it's the youth football and cheerleading program. It's not exactly affiliated with the Town Hall. There's a distinction there, it's not Town Hall Rec, it is a separate organization. They would be covered if it was under the Town Hall Rec, but they where they're playing right now, they said they're unable to cover interpreters because of lack of funding, so it's something separate from that person. So we're just hoping that perhaps you could help provide some funding for interpreters for the expenses that the private organization said they've been unable to take care of.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

I'd still like to hear Regis give any comment he may have, Regis?

REGIS STEINKAMP, DIRECTOR OF YOUTH AND RECREATION

Occasionally . . .

(From audience - inaudible)

REGIS STEINKAMP, DIRECTOR OF YOUTH AND RECREATION

Regis Steinkamp.

(From audience - inaudible)

REGIS STEINKAMP, DIRECTOR OF YOUTH AND RECREATION

Recreation and Youth Bureau Director.

LISA HOWARD

Okay, Thank you.

REGIS STEINKAMP, DIRECTOR OF YOUTH AND RECREATION

. . . and I guess I'm a little confused, because I'm not sure what organization that you're talking about? Is it the Rush-Henrietta Royal Comets?

LISA HOWARD

Yes, correct.

REGIS STEINKAMP, DIRECTOR OF YOUTH AND RECREATION

Yes, okay, so that is, that's not a Town program. We'd make every attempt when we have a request for interpreters for one (1) of the Town's Recreation programs to provide them. We get them through R.I.T., we get them sometimes through the High School, sometimes there's volunteers through the Community, as you know interpreters can be very expensive, between probably twenty-five (\$25.00) and seventy-five (\$75.00) dollars an hour. Obviously, we have an obligation to provide interpreters on a request and in the six (6) years I've been here, we've met those requests on every occasion, I think it would probably be a Board decision as to whether we would get involved in supplying interpreters for children who are participating in groups like RHAA or football programs, that aren't Town affiliated. I'd certainly be willing to help with that process because we have the contacts, but . . .

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Does the Rush-Henrietta School District have a program to provide for this kind of help?

REGIS STEINKAMP, DIRECTOR OF YOUTH AND RECREATION

Yes, they hire interpreters and sometimes we get our interpreters through the High School . . .

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Okay.

REGIS STEINKAMP, DIRECTOR OF YOUTH AND RECREATION

. . . we pay them.

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

Is this a Rush-Henrietta program though? It's independent of that as well, right?

REGIS STEINKAMP, DIRECTOR OF YOUTH AND RECREATION

Right. It's a Community organization.

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

Okay.

(From Audience - inaudible)

LISA HOWARD

I'm not sure where else we could go, I mean. Our deaf children are really suffering without interpreters, it's very hard for them to follow what's going on with their teams, cheerleading and football, so we just thought we'd bring it to the Board for approval. Perhaps you know someone else who can help us, if you're not able to. I think also I wanted to add, we've been informed by the program, a support center that perhaps Rush-Henrietta might have a community wide funding source that they would be able to pull from to help pay for the interpreters. It's a community fund, perhaps that we would be able to tap in to?

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Okay. Thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN McCABE

Through you, Mr. Supervisor, have you approached the Rotary? And, or, Kiwanis? K.I.W.A.N.I.S., right.

LISA HOWARD

Well, actually I have never heard of the Kiwanis but perhaps if you give me the information, I'd be happy to try and contact them and see if we can receive any kind of support from them. I just, we would love to have your help too as the Town, we're so loyal to our community and very involved and we just thought that perhaps, you know we've lived here for so long that perhaps something could be done for us.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Perhaps. We'll take a look at it.

COUNCILMAN YUDELSON

Excuse me, as far as just a couple other suggestions, before going on to the Town Board, I was the Recreation Director, and we would deal with this a lot, and just some of the resources that are in the community whether through N.T.I.D. or even through the School District, whether there might be students who are taking sign language who would volunteer some of their time and the other thing I was going to suggest . . .

LISA HOWARD

We've actually tried that before.

COUNCILMAN YUDELSON

Okay.

LISA HOWARD

I'm sorry, I don't want to interrupt you, but I definitely, we have already tried so many different contacts and I appreciate your ideas but, often what will happen is the N.T.I.D. students are actually just student interpreters, they're actually not in skills enough to really interpret. They're somewhere between basic, basic language learners, and on their way to interpreting, but it's extremely different between a training interpreter and a real skilled interpreter. Often someone who is training, you know, will leave the deaf children out just because of their lack of language, not on purpose. The deaf children are often, you know, waiting to know what's going on and their not able to take part really full part in the team and all the socializing and all the actual learning, so I mean, I understand, and also another thing that was mentioned, is that the students aren't actually available for the fall because they are just starting the program. They're only

available for the spring. So it's not really of much use to us in this situation, we've really tried so many different ways, we really have, um, we've worked so hard to make contacts and this was just one of our last resources to see if you could help us.

COUNCILMAN YUDELSON

The other thing I was going to say, just two (2) other things, I don't know what they might yield, would be trying to generate a news story just in case there was anyone there who then had resources to bring to bear and then the only other thing I'd be glad to make a phone call, there is a Town resident who is a professional interpreter, most of us on the Board know Barb Haschmann, and that's what she does for a living and might have some ideas, I'd be glad to follow up with her and get back to you.

LISA HOWARD

That would be great. Thank you. I know the important thing is to just keep in contact with us so that we can work with you and do this together, that would be great. I think, this is also, this is the second year we've had this problem, just so you're aware of that, what, sorry?

SUPERVISOR BREESE

I want to thank you for coming here and giving us this information. It's something that we have to consider. We want to help in any way we can, and I can't give you a definite answer now.

LINDA HOWARD

That would be excellent.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

At least we now know about the issue, and thank you for presenting that to us.

LINDA HOWARD

I'm wondering if you could perhaps give us an idea of when a good time to follow-up would be, would we hear from you or should we contact you again, just to expect, a bit more resolution . . .

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Why don't you . . .

LINDA HOWARD

. . .just to know where we stand?

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Why don't you contact my office in about two (2) weeks, how's that?

LINDA HOWARD

Sure, and who's office is this?

SUPERVISOR BREESE
The Supervisor's office.

LINDA HOWARD
Okay, great. I really appreciate your time.
SUPERVISOR BREESE
Okay, thanks very much.

COUNCILMAN YUDELSON
Before, before you leave the podium ma'am, is e-mail, I would assume a good way to communicate?

LINDA HOWARD
E-mail is definitely the best way, yes, whole heartedly, definitely e-mail.

SUPERVISOR BREESE
You know how to do that, you've been e-mailing with our Town Clerk, I think, on a regular basis?

LINDA HOWARD
Yes, that was us, yes.

SUPERVISOR BREESE
That's fine, that works.

. . . it's actually the funding for the interpreters.

SUPERVISOR BREESE
Okay, very good. Thanks for coming, thanks kids for being here.

LISA HOWARD

We actually have some information, if you're interested? Should we leave it up here?

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Yes, please. Please pass it out, yes. Or give it to the Clerk and she'll distribute it. Yes, thanks so much for coming. Is there somebody else who'd like to speak on any other items about the Town before we adjourn? Yes, Sir.
