LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF 2007

**AMENDING CHAPTER 219
SEWERS TOWN CODE
TOWN OF HENRIETTA**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF HENRIETTA, that Chapter 219, entitled "Sewers," of the Code of the Town of Henrietta shall be amended as follows:

CHAPTER 219, SEWER IMPACT FEES

COUNCILMAN YUDELSON

Through you, Mr. Supervisor, just for clarification, this is the same Public Hearing that we've been calling for that was the subject of discussion of a Town Board Workshop a couple of months ago. We we're going to call for the Hearing at that time, but then it was pulled from the Agenda because it was determined that the fee could be approved in house, is that correct?

SUPERVISOR BREESE

I don't know, I wasn't at the meeting. Mr. Mastrella?

DANIEL MASTRELLA, TOWN ATTORNEY

It's my understanding that this is that same impact fee that was discussed at Workshop and then there was inquiry a couple of weeks ago, and I did a Memo to the Board, and this is the same Commercial and multi-dwelling apartment fee.

COUNCILMAN YUDELSON

And you had advised the Board that this should go before the Town Board for a Public Hearing.

DANIEL MASTRELLA, TOWN ATTORNEY

That's correct, I believe it requires a Public Hearing.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

That was really the only issue, was whether it needed a Public Hearing or not, and you said it did, and that's fine with me.

COUNCILMAN YUDELSON

My question, just from procedural, is that, I know property owner's, apartment owner's, that kind of thing, were notified of this fee already, that important discussion in our last Workshop, the bills were getting ready to go out, so as far as the time of that, are people actually being billed for that, if they've been notified that they would be?

SUPERVISOR BREESE

I'm not aware of that, Chuck do you know anything about that, whether bills were sent out, that shouldn't have been sent out or whatever, maybe Pettrone, maybe you know, were some bills sent out that shouldn't have been sent out?

PAUL PETTRONE, SUPERINTENDENT OF DRAINAGE, SEWER, AND SIDEWALKS

We have not sent any bills out with the impact fee attached.

I guess what I'm referring to is I believe a letter was sent out that a fee had been instituted.

WHEREAS, Erie Station West Henrietta, LLC, the Developer of Erie Station at West Henrietta, located on the east side of West Henrietta Road and South of the New York State Thruway, proposes the construction of an eight (8) inch sanitary sewer crossing the existing State of New York right-of-way and land owned by the New York State Thruway Authority on West Henrietta Road, Route 15, Town of Henrietta, as shown on plans prepared by Corneles Engineering, P.C., dated August 8, 2007, and

WHEREAS, the State of New York and the New York State Thruway Authority will only allow sanitary sewer crossing within the right-of-way if the Town of Henrietta accepts ownership of only the new sanitary sewer installed and maintenance of the entire length of sanitary sewer crossing West Henrietta Road.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that:

1. The Town of Henrietta will assume ownership of the above-mentioned utility crossing in the State right-of-way and in lands owned by the New York State Thruway Authority.

2. That upon assuming ownership of the above-mentioned utility crossing, the Town of Henrietta agrees to maintain the above-mentioned utility crossing.
3. That upon assuming ownership of the above-mentioned utility crossing, the Town of Henrietta agrees to accept all responsibility and liability with respect to said utility crossing and to hold the State of New York and the New York State Thruway Authority harmless with respect to said features.
4. That this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
5. That the Town Clerk of the Town of Henrietta is hereby directed to transmit five (5) Certified copies of the foregoing Resolution to the New York State Department of Transportation and the New York State Thruway Authority.

Okay, that's the end of the regular meeting. Before we adjourn, is there someone who'd like to speak on any other items involving the Town of Henrietta? Do you want to speak, Tony?

(From audience, Tony Kemmer, "No.")

(From audience, resident, "I do.")

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Okay, fine.

GAYNELLE WETHERS, 1397 CALKINS ROAD

My name is Gaynelle Wethers, and I reside at 1397 Calkins Road. I appeared before the Town Meeting last month in regards to a "no parking" sign that was placed on my property without my knowledge or consent, or support. Several weeks ago when the sewage was being dug up across the street, and they had dump trucks parked all along the side, and a "no parking" sign was placed there because they said it was a safety issue, and no one was there to direct traffic. I have photos of those. Also, in addition, while I was doing that, my neighbor's daughter came over to inform me, that my house was not the one that was of issue, it was the neighbor across the other way, on the other side of Mr. Sennet's (*sp*) home, they were dealing with some drainage, and water

issues. And the issue with the “stop sign” at the corner, which is about four (4) driveways away from me. I’m requesting just simply to take the sign down. If there’s an issue with Mr. Sennet’s (sp) home, and the homes across on the other side of him, that should be addressed. But the safety issue is not an issue on my corner, and I’m requesting again for justice to remove the sign, thank you.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

I think you spoke at the meeting in August, and there was some discussion with the Highway Superintendent about the matter. This is really an Administrative matter, it doesn’t require any Town Board action. The Highway Superintendent has certain powers under State Law, and I have a lot of confidence in Rusty Martin’s decisions in such matters, and I don’t intend to interfere with what he has done so far. So whatever action he has taken, as far as I’m concerned, that settles the matter.

(Gaynelle Wethers, 1397 Calkins Road - inaudible)

SUPERVISOR BREESE

That’s it, that’s it. And if you want to talk again, you have to come back up to the mic. But it settles the matter as far as I’m concerned.

GAYNELLE WETHERS, 1397 CALKINS ROAD

The issue is that my home is the only home in Henrietta that has a “no parking” sign, and it’s wrong. And not only that it was based on bad information. I don’t have a problem if the information was accurate, and someone is informed. The outrage is the fact that no one informed me. That was wrong. That was what the injustice is. It is simply wrong, and it’s not over.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

It’s over as far as I’m concerned.

GAYNELLE WETHERS, 1397 CALKINS ROAD

That’s okay.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Okay. Anyone else like to speak on any other items? Yes.

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

Linus Rautenstrauch, 1412 Martin Road. I have an article from the Democrat and Chronicle, dated June 9, 2007, listing eighteen (18) featured Rochester home builder’s in the Rochester area. I have a number of them here, I’ll just name a few. Faber’s mentioned, Gerber Homes, Home Pride Builders, Cartis Homes, were all builders, Orchid View Builders, Park Properties, Ryan Homes, Viola Homes, Spal Homes, etc. I’m wondering why only a few of the builders that I have seen, and I realize I’m not familiar with all that goes on in the Town, but only a few of the listed builders, built in Henrietta. I just wonder if anyone in the Town Board is aware of this or how come

these builders don't build in the Town of Henrietta? I would just like to know. Cartis Builders, I have never seen a sign of them building any homes. Pride Marc Homes, Ryan homes I know, Faber does, Park Properties, I don't know. I don't know of the other ones. I'm just wondering if anyone is aware of that, or if there's a reason we may only have two (2) or three (3) developers that build in these particular complexes.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

I don't know why they don't build in Henrietta.

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

Well, I would just like to think that maybe we ought to be looking into other builders in the Town of Henrietta besides just two (2) or three (3).

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Well, we have more than two (2) or three (3) in Henrietta.

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

Well I just wondered if there's . . .

SUPERVISOR BREESE

If you want a list of them, you could see Jeff Wilkinson in our Building and Development Department. He could give you a list of the number of builder's. There's more than two (2) or three (3).

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

Okay, I understand that I've named two (2) or three (3), I just wondered if there's more. Okay, I wonder if the Town has planned in the Budget to eventually replace a few of the "Welcome to the Town of Henrietta" signs. I know that the one we replaced in the Locust Hill Golf Course is great. This presents a good eye appeal, and curb appeal in the Town of Henrietta. I know they have several others, but there's also a number of those metal signs still existing.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

We're still working on the Budget, so thank you.

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

Okay, I know you're very happy that I've done that.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

We like the signs too, the new ones.

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

Thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN McCABE

Linus, the Chamber of Commerce did help pay for the signs. Maybe we can get them to chip in, too.

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

Looking forward to the completion of the new Wegmans Store. I wonder if on the corner of Calkins Road, and Route 15A, or East Henrietta Road, Lehigh Station and East Henrietta Road, there could be hanging flower baskets that could be placed in each intersection at the above locations, and maintained on a daily basis by the Town. Also, it would look nice if we had some, I think coming in the aisle, coming in through the Town at the drive-way here, and they do really add a lot of curb appeal. They're very attractive, and they sort of show a lot of class. When this is done, this has great eye appeal, and the Four Corners of Pittsford, and the 441, and 250, and I think it's the Town of Penfield. This could possibly be a program created by the Town, and the local businesses.

We'll take a look at it.

Thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

Good idea Linus! Great idea.

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

Pardon?

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

I think it's a great idea.

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

Thank you.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Anyone else? Yes. Now you want to speak. That's okay. You have to come up here, like everyone else.

TONY KEMMER, 39 CLOONEY DRIVE

Tony Kemmer, 39 Clooney Drive, Henrietta.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

What was your name, again?

TONY KEMMER, 39 CLOONEY DRIVE

Tony Kemmer.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Okay, go ahead.

TONY KEMMER, 39 CLOONEY DRIVE

I did get to take a bike ride this weekend, and it was very nice after a long time, and I found out how great it is to access the Town Hall and stuff from all the bike trails around the Town, and I had spoken to a couple Town Board Members about a situation, earlier this year, where some roadways, I felt, were not accurately marked. And that's following expansion. This weekend on my bike ride, I came across to another place where I felt it was serious and dangerous. So my question is, do you have anyone assigned to look at the different bike paths and things where they cross the arteries in Henrietta to see whether everything is accurately marked, or reasonably marked. Like the one I crossed was going down the hills of Lehigh where Authors crosses, not Authors, the one below Authors, Nevins crosses there. When people come over those knolls if there are any signs that are indicating that there's bike crossings there, they could be speeding too fast again, and someone could get seriously injured. Okay, thank you very much.

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

Thank you.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Yes, Sir.

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

Linus Rautenstrauch. At the Town Park on Martin Road, the benches that were placed around the pond have been used quite a bit. I've used them once, but I know there's been a number of other people. So the people that did it did a good job. Also, in the future is there any possibility of a nice looking attractive, curb appealing, eye appealing sign that would go in there, that would look really great besides that brown dumpy looking thing. That's starting to fall.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

That's a temporary sign.

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

I noticed. I hope it is! It looks terrible.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

To answer your question, yes.

LINUS RAUTENSTRAUCH, 1412 MARTIN ROAD

Okay, thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN McCABE

We're going to get a new one for that.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Okay. Yes, Ma'am.

RACHEL WARREN, 59 TOMAHAWK TRAIL

I have a question I probably shouldn't ask.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

You have to give us your name and address.

RACHEL WARREN, 59 TOMAHAWK TRAIL

Rachel Warren, 59 Tomahawk Trail. I have a question about where this new development is going to go. The East Henrietta Commons, specifically . . .

SUPERVISOR BREESE

It's across from Suburban plaza, I believe. It's a small strip plaza. It was Approved quite some time ago, and I don't think you were here. We probably would have heard from you about it.

RACHEL WARREN, 59 TOMAHAWK TRAIL

So, it's already been Approved?

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Oh yeah.

RACHEL WARREN, 59 TOMAHAWK TRAIL

We really don't need another one, and you know that.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

You're too late, I'm sorry. Yes?

BETH WHITE, 1001 MIDDLE ROAD

Beth White, 1001 Middle Road. Just to piggy back on what Linus what saying about Martin Road Park, the signs are up, so it's made a big, big difference in the number of people who are know having their dogs on leashes, and who are picking up after their dogs. And I appreciate it, thank you. However . . .

SUPERVISOR BREESE

There's always something else.

BETH WHITE, 1001 MIDDLE ROAD

You know there's going to be something else. My dog and I like to walk around the pond. That's a very favorite walk of ours, is going around the pond. And I can't tell you the yards, and yards of fishing line I have picked up, and the lures, and the fishing hooks. They're just left laying there. I am just so afraid, that not only my dog might step on something like this, but so many kids play down there that they might get caught up in this. My granddaughter and I were walking down there last week, and she picked up a lure, and said, "Grandma, this shouldn't be here", and I said, "No, you're absolutely right, it shouldn't." But I come out of there almost after every walk with yards and yards of fishing line, and so on. I'm just wondering if maybe two (2), or three (3) signs could be put up right around the pond reminding them not to leave those kinds of things there.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

I'll discuss it with our parks foreman, thank you very much.

BETH WHITE, 1001 MIDDLE ROAD

Thank you.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Anyone else before we adjourn?

COUNCILMAN YUDELSON

I move we adjourn.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

Is there a Second?

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

Second.

SUPERVISOR BREESE

No objections? Meeting adjourned.

The Regular Meeting of the Henrietta Town Board was moved for adjournment by Councilman Yudelton, seconded by Councilwoman Zinck at 8:25 P.M. and passed unanimously.
