RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF HENRIETTA APPROVING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF EXTENSION NO. 155 (HOLY SEPULCHRE CEMETERY) TO HENRIETTA WATER DISTRICT NO. 1

WHEREAS, a proposal has been made in the Town Board of the Town of Henrietta, County of Monroe, State of New York, (the "Town"), to establish Extension No. 155 to extend Henrietta Water District No. 1 in the following described portion of Town, which is wholly within said Town, outside of any incorporated village or city, and currently outside the boundaries of said Water District ("Extension No. 155") a109+/- acre cemetery to be constructed by Holy Sepulchre Cemetery ("HSC") and located on the east side of Pinnacle Road and north of Williams Road in the Town of Henrietta, County of Monroe, State of New York (Tax Account No. 203.01-2-21), and

WHEREAS, the Town Board was presented with the necessary maps, plans, and report for Extension No. 155, which were prepared under the supervision of the Town Engineer and which were duly filed with the Town Clerk's Office as required under Town Law (the "Maps, Plans and Report"), and

WHEREAS, the Town Board validly passed an Order for a Public Hearing on Extension No. 155 at its Meeting on August 20, 2008 (the "Order"), and

WHEREAS, the Town Clerk published and posted notice of the Order and the Public Hearing on Extension No. 155, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board now wishes to approve the establishment of Extension No. 155.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the establishment of Extension No. 155 to the Henrietta Water District No. 1 as set forth in the Maps, Plans, and Report be approved; that the improvement therein mentioned be constructed and the service therein mentioned be provided for upon the required funds being made available or provided for; and that such Extension shall be designated and known as Extension No. 155 to Henrietta Water District No. 1 and shall be bounded as described in attachments annexed hereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk of this Town shall, within ten (10) days after the adoption of this Resolution, file Certified copies thereof in duplicate in the Office of the State Department of Audit and Control at Albany, New York.

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COUNCILWOMAN McCABE

Under discussion, Mr. Supervisor, we have been looking at carpeting for the Library, we have been updating the roof, and the facility to stop the leaks, the carpeting that's there now is worn, I feel that it's a liability issue number one (1) if we don't repair it or put new carpeting in, number two (2) with the economy the way it is we're going to have a lot more people in there, and that even increases those liability issues, so rather than go through that I am going to vote "Yes" on this one.

COUNCILMAN MOORE

Mr. Supervisor, for clarification reasons, is this a budgeted item?

SUPERVISOR YUDELSON

This was not budgeted.

COUNCILMAN MOORE

And, what fund is it coming out of?

SUPERVISOR YUDELSON

Our Finance Director will have to identify whether it'll probably have to come out of the General Fund or other allocated or unused monies, I'll let Mr. Liess speak to that, and in a more specific fashion.

PAUL LIESS, DIRECTOR OF FINANCE

It will be coming out of the General Fund out of the Facilities Maintenance, and actually it can transfer in from your Capital Improvements, if that's what the Board decides to do.

COUNCILWOMAN McCABE

Thank you.

COUNCILMAN MOORE

Has it been budgeted in prior years?

SUPERVISOR YUDELSON

No.

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

No, it has not.

SUPERVISOR YUDELSON

It's been requested by the Library before, but was never stated in the Budget, the final Budget that is approved by the Town Board.

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

I believe this is at least the third year they've asked for it.

COUNCILMAN MOORE

But, I would think that it should be part of a Library Budget, a Capital purchase.

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

It's a facility it should be part of our Facility Budget.

SUPERVISOR YUDELSON

We have a Capital Fund, if we decide to take it out of there that was set up or it is a part of our facilities, and I think that certainly it would be reasonable, and it certainly wouldn't be the first project that we've done that wasn't contained in the Budget, but that we thought it was necessary.

COUNCILWOMAN McCABE

The facilities, the Library itself is not owned by the Library, so they don't put it in their Budget because their Budget mostly consists of the books and media and that kind of shelving, and that kind of thing. There are times though when the friends of the Library have received donations, and they have come in and fixed things that were actually our purview to fix, but they spent the money on it. And, so I think it's time now for us to step up, and get this Library repaired.

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

That's a good point.

COUNCILWOMAN McCABE

The ceiling is dripping, I'm just sick of hearing it.

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

The other point is that's it's a petroleum product, and it's just going to keep going up.

COUNCILWOMAN McCABE

It's just going to keep going up, right.

COUNCILWOMAN ZINCK

So, I will vote "Yes."

SUPERVISOR YUDELSON

And, I do want to thank Councilwoman Zinck for keeping this on our table for discussion, and also Chuck Marshall for doing a lot of the leg work on trying to get prices, and I agree with Councilman Mulligan, it would have been nice to get more bids. We had prices to look at from State Contract as well as this vendor who goes under County

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Contract, but we can't force anybody to come in and make the bid. I will support this, as well. Is there further discussion? Call the roll, please.

Just, I remember briefly and Chuck, maybe you can remember, did we end up getting some kind of warranty on this so we're not getting calls from unhappy Library patrons? I know one (1) time they weren't willing to give us a warranty of some kind.

CHUCK MARSHALL, COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS

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We're going to get a full year's warranty on all the labor and so on that went into it, and the materials that go with it would just have the manufacturer's warranty, whether it be two (2) years, three (3) years, depending on the flashing materials and the steel materials they use on the roof.

You got that in writing?

CHUCK MARSHALL, COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS

Yes.

COUNCILMAN MULLIGAN

Thank you.

COUNCILMAN MOORE

Chuck, is the job complete now?

CHUCK MARSHALL, COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS

No, all we're waiting for now is the louvers to go over the side, our east and west side vents, that's a two (2) step painting process, and they don't do it at their facility, it had to be farmed out, so as soon as those come back then those will be put on, and we should be able to finish it up.

COUNCILMAN MOORE

Have you seen any rain since they've done the improvements, and have any indication of whether they were successful?

CHUCK MARSHALL, COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS

I have not received any complaints from the Library, at this point, of any leakage, and I have not witnessed any so hopefully we got it where we wanted it.

COUNCILMAN MOORE

Good, thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN McCABE

I know that we okayed the carpeting, can you make sure that roof is not leaking before the carpeting goes in?

CHUCK MARSHALL, COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS

Yes.

Could you advise me to what the Town Board has done to work with the Town of Henrietta Fire Commissioners to educate the Rochester Institute of Technology in reference to the high cost of services provided by the Henrietta Fire District? It's approximately a six million dollar (\$6,000,000) Fire District Budget, and approximately sixteen thousand (16,000) students at R.I.T., I feel the program has to be developed to initiate R.I.T. to realize the high costs of fire services, and the cost to the Henrietta taxpayer. When one fifth (1/5) of the calls are responses to R.I.T, I feel they have an obligation to the tax payers to pay their fair share towards their expenses, towards these expenses. The donation that they gave, which is around thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) does not even begin to cover one fifth (1/5) of the operation budget of the Henrietta Fire District. My information in regarding the donation and the number of calls was obtained through a telephone conversation with one (1) of the Fire Commissioners.

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I am not here to complain, but I feel the high cost of taxes to the residents of Henrietta, maybe things should be looked into to try and work out a fair and equitable solution for services rendered to the R.I.T. community. A fire and safety service protection fee to each student of ten dollars (\$10.00) a semester would definitely help to deflate cost accumulated from the Fire District for their protections services rendered towards the maintenance of equipment. The Board could look into further information regarding Cornell University paying for protection services to the City of Ithaca since 1967. In 2007, they contributed a measly one point one million dollars (1,100,000) to the city, and the Fire Department received sixty-six thousand (\$66,000), approximately sixty percent (60%). R.I.T.'s presence in our community creates demands in our community for municipal services particularly in the area of fire protection, and it also creates demands, I think, to the Town of Henrietta, and to the Highway Department, and any other Town employee that has anything to do with and around the school district. Thank you.
